Degree Law, economics, management Specialisation Economics and management Course Accounts / Finance / Economics / Management

Aims

This degree gives students solid basic training in economics and management. It is based on a study of different areas of economic and management analysis, as well as a mastery of the mathematical, statistical and I.T. instruments used in economics and management. As well as these skills and knowledge expected from students is added the acquisition of a good level of general knowledge fostered by additional courses in law, history or sociology, and a satisfactory level in English, with the option for students to learn a second language.

- § The MANAGEMENT degree course aims to train versatile managers. The course is particularly centred on helping students develop diagnostic skills in the different areas of management. By providing a basis of general knowledge in management, this course in particular can lead to a master's degree in one of the 4 management specialisations on offer at the IAE of Saint-Étienne: Project management, International management, Management of Health Organisations and Management of Trade and Distribution.
- § The **FINANCE degree course** aims at providing basic knowledge to students planning to continue their studies in the finance sector in a broad sense, and to work in financial institutions or in the financial services of companies. It mainly leads to a master's degree in Management Control and Organisational Auditing (CGAO) and Money, Banking, Finance, Insurance (MBFA) also on offer at IAE Saint-Étienne.
- § The ECONOMICS degree course reinforces knowledge in economic theory and a mastery of basic tools of economic data processing. It leads to one of the 3 master's degrees in Analysis and Economic Policy (APE) offered at IAE Saint-Étienne: Economic Intelligence & Innovation Management, Consultancy in Territorial Development and Game Theory, Experimental Economics and Applied Eco- nometrics.
- The ACCOUNTANCY degree course is based on the accountancy and management (DCG) diploma, and is aimed at training staff in accountancy firms or head accountant assistants in companies, working with small-scale structures with relatively straightforward accounting and legal issues. By providing a solid basis of knowledge about the accounting and legal disciplines, this course's main aim is for students to continue on to a master's degree with a specialisation in accountancy-control-auditing, with access in particular to an internship at a chartered accountant's.

The first three terms correspond to an identical basic course with no difference between the types of course.
